



In an agency-wide consumer satisfaction survey conducted in 2021, 81% of the 288 respondents felt that the conditions in their lives had improved because of the services North Shore CAP provided them with.

Last year, North Shore CAP assisted 8,404

low-income individuals to achieve economic and social stability through programs such as energy services, fuel assistance, home health services, adult education classes, workforce readiness, and housing and homelessness prevention. North Shore Community Action Programs' (NSCAP)

service area is within the central region of Essex County, Massachusetts. This area contains a population of 202,347 with 17,889 living below the poverty line.
